- Mix of uphill and downhill, plus cobblestone terrain




















Lake Rotopounamu

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Te Porere Redoubt

Te Porere redoubt, which was 'reconstructed' by the Historic Places Trust around 1960.

The last major battle of the New Zealand Wars was fought at Te Porere, in the shadow of Tongariro, on 4 October 1869. This was a defensive position styled ineptly on a European redoubt. Te Kooti was defeated by a combined force of Armed Constabulary and Māori fighters 'from all points of the compass'. Although 37 of his followers were killed and he lost the middle fingers of his left hand, Te Kooti avoided capture.

Dear Parents/Guardians

Year 10 OUTDOOR EDUCATION PROGRAMME 24 - 28 November 2025

Towards the end of Term 4, Year 10 students will be involved in a week-long Outdoor Education Programme. Most of the activities start on Monday, 24 November and run through to Friday, 28 November 2025.

As a school, we create programmes which match our Physical Education – Outdoor Education policy, offering experiences to enrich your son's time at Palmerston North Boys' High School. It is our intention to provide a range of outdoor education programmes to cater for the varied interests within the Year 10 student cohort. These programmes do incur costs, primarily for transport, accommodation, and commercial activities.

We recognise that the Canoe the Whanganui programme carries a higher cost; however, its distinctive and adventurous nature offers students a truly exceptional experience that would otherwise be difficult to access outside of school—especially at the significantly reduced rate we are able to provide.

Selecting camps five months in advance aims to ease payment for families and ensure fair access for all students.

The school has encountered a problem with late pullouts from camps, which often results in significant losses. This situation is impractical for the school. Your son is asked to be thoughtful in his selection.

Payment for your son's camp must be fully paid by **Friday**, **31 October 2025** (Term 4, Week 4). Payments may be submitted prior to invoicing and the specified due date.

ALPINE ADVENTURES

Cost: \$480.00

Our group will stay at the Massey University Alpine Club Lodge, close to the Turoa Mountain Road, on Mt Ruapehu.

This site is well above the bush line and looks down over the lights of Ohakune each night. The wind can blow, and the views are simply amazing.

Except for a scheduled raft trip on the Rangitikei River on Wednesday, we will be flexible to some extent so that we can choose the best weather window to drop into the Mangaturuturu Valley for an overnight stay in this stunning valley with possibly the best views of Ruapehu from any place in the Tongario National Park. Camping in the valley will be under flies or tents in the trees around the small Mangaturuturu Hut and during that time, a short walk will take us to the nearby Mangaturuturu Falls, the most powerful but rarely visited waterfall in the Tongarior National Park. Swimming under the falls is both fun and chilly.

We expect to take the very short walk to the twin Hapuawhenua Viaducts, located at the end of the historic Ohakune Coach Road.

One day will involve a trip to the Tokaanu Thermal area, including a visit to Tokaanu Hot pools, with a stop at Te Porere Redoubt and some other sights on the way.

A quick visit to the National Army Museum will complete the week.

Costs will cover all meals except Monday lunch. Our few days really are in a stunning area.

CANOE THE WHANGANUI

Cost: \$660.00

Experience real New Zealand! A remote and awesome wilderness adventure of 100km over five days, carrying all gear and food in Canadian canoes down the Whanganui River from Whakahoro to Pipiriki. Includes a visit to the Bridge to Nowhere, powhini at Tieke Marae and other exciting outdoor challenges. Experience not necessary – introductory on-water training provided by certified guides. Cost includes 3 main meals per day plus some snacks (biscuits, Iollies, scroggin, fruit), all on-water equipment, DOC passes and bus transport from and to PNBHS. Guides will do all cooking. Camping in tents at DOC campsites beside the river.
